We have family members who now live far away, finding the time to travel to reconnect with their ancestors, and rekindle their memories in the peace of our memorial garden.

However, what has proved a challenge, is meeting the expectation that individual rose plants, and individual plaques, will remain untouched over the decades from where they were first located. It has been quite a shock for some relatives to discover that these are no longer intact, with a sense of anguish that somehow the memories of their loved ones have been disrespected. If only we could have kept in touch with all these relatives and helped them understand the decisions the PCC has needed to make over the years to deal with decaying rose bushes and making the plaque arrangement sustainable.



Fortunately, and with from the tireless work of Roger and Shaun as the gardening team, and Kat in the office, more and families more are reconnecting with us to arrange for a sustainable plaque to be installed on our memorial posts. Any legacy plaques that have been temporarily removed are being kept securely or respectfully placed in a side bed whilst we are in transition.
